2.40 (a) (1)

ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

(1) Each dealer and exhibitor shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements. In the case of a part-time attending veterinarian or consultant arrangements, the formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the dealer or exhibitor; and

The program of Veterinary care was incomplete or missing information, that was necessary to reflect the current practices at the facility.

The section referring to ectoparasites stated the facility would use a topical preventive monthly. According to the applicant it would be done as needed when parasites were observed.

Ivomec was listed in the sections pertaining to both blood and intestinal parasites, but only indicated how it would be administered to adults but not in .

In the section regarding methods of euthanasia, the drug to be used was not listed.

Applicant must consult with the attending veterinarian to update the program of veterinary care to reflect all current practices being conducted at the facility.

(2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care;

There was a tube of gold bond ointment that has an expiration date of 11-2002 on the tube.

This is an out of date medicine that may no longer work as intended.

This needs to be disposed of, and check for any other outdated medicines that may also need to be removed.

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There were several extra label medications at the facility ready for use and intermingled with other dog medications. The following products (Gold bond) ointment and powder, Triple antibiotic, Athletes foot powder, Ivarest poison ivy ointment, safe guard wormer, fish oilcapsules.

These do not have labeled directions for dogs. All of these medications have directions for humans or livestock. Applicant must consult with veterinarian to obtain approval for the use of these medications along with dosing instructions.

3.9 (b)

FEEDING.

(b) Food receptacles must be used for dogs and cats, must be readily accessible to all dogs and cats, and must be located so as to minimize contamination by excreta and pests, and be protected from rain and snow. Feeding pans must either be made of a durable material that can be easily cleaned and sanitized or be disposable. If the food receptacles are not disposable, they must be kept clean and must be sanitized in accordance with Sec. 3.11(b) of this subpart. Sanitization is achieved by using one of the methods described in Sec. 3.11(b)(3) of this subpart. If the food receptacles are disposable, they must be discarded after one use. Self-feeders may be used for the feeding of dry food. If self-feeders are used, they must be kept clean and must be sanitized in accordance with Sec. 3.11(b) of this subpart. Measures must be taken to ensure that there is no molding, deterioration, and caking of feed.

The dog feeders are made of plastic type material and have been chewed and pitted to the point they could harbor bacteria.

These need to be repaired or replaced to allow the cleaning and sanitizing of this area.

This inspection and exit interview was conducted with owner and Jerry West ACI, and Jennifer Schmitz CS, No regulated activities may be conducted until USDA license is issued and all items must be in compliance, within 2 more inspections or by May 27 2013.

Or applicant will forfeit application fee and must wait 6 months to reapply.

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
